- ☰ Why “versioning”?
 - ☰ CM under another name
 - ☰ because “configuration management” is scary!
- ☰ “Everything is a versioning problem”
 - ☰ My hought for today
- ☰ “Versioning” and “Configuration Management” are much the same thing
 - ☰ But I'm old-school CM....

- ☰ “It's all about getting the right version of your software when you go live”

- ☰ **WRONG!**

- ☰ Well, only up to a point, Lord Copper

- ☰ Hence people are talking about “versioning”

- ☰ It gets you away from IT and its preoccupation with SCM (“software configuraion management”)


- ☰ RM tool introducing proper CM
 - ☰ Because of many people managing requirements for many product lines
- ☰ NYSE building its systems on a CM software platform
 - ☰ Because “everything we do is potentially audited or regulated”
- ☰ Pixar using CM for stories and sound clips

- ☰ A Configuration Management System is **the automated system that tracks the attributes and history of everything you think is necessary to deliver a business service**
 - ☰ and **relationships** between these things
 - ☰ It implements a process
- ☰ This might include training courses, telephones and office desks
 - ☰ But probably not pencils, even if they are necessary

- ☰ The CMS is not just a CMDB (or even lots of federated CMDBs)
 - ☰ The CMDB is just the bucket you keep its data in
- ☰ The CMS is not about software licenses and keeping FAST off your back
 - ☰ Although it will build on good asset management

- ☰ If you want to fail with a CMS, just track everything you can think of or have data for
 - ☰ Then think about what you'll do with it
- ☰ Even better, make people fill in all the fields in your CMDB
 - ☰ Then don't use the data
 - ☰ And/or don't correlate it with the real world
- ☰ “My CMDB is bigger than yours!”
 - ☰ doesn't impress anyone

Use of your CMS

-  by people using it for business deliverables, such as the storyline and avatars in a computer game

Staff enthusiasm

-  From people using it to make their lives easier

Respect

-  Regulators believing that you're in control

- ▣ An effective CMS makes for happy customers
 - ▣ and happy business partners
 - ▣ even happy acquirers, if that's what you want
- ▣ Because an effective CMS means **No Surprises!**
 - ▣ How can you function if you aren't managing what you need to deliver business services?
